The PCNC activities are aimed at improving optimal health and wellness, through promotion and prevention programs at individual, group, and or joint care with other IHP. The PCNC is responsible for the assessment, planning, coordination and delivery of services, consistent with the principles of primary health care, to designated populations and their families and caregivers. Working in collaboration with the primary provider and interdisciplinary team, the PCNC will share expertise and knowledge of health promotion, disease prevention and chronic disease management with a goal to improving access and patient self-management.
